# Architect put print on area landmarks

S. Derrick Mozingo founded his architectural firm in Myrtle Beach in 1985, naming it S. Derrick Mozingo & Associates.

Funny thing about that name, though. He was the S. Derrick Mozingo and the associates.

It was his way of... well, let him tell you.

"When I moved here, I didn't have any associates, and that [name] just sounded more im-

pressive," he said.

That was 17 years ago. Mozingo left an apprenticeship with a Florence architectural firm and headed to the beach with a vision of making a name for himself and changing the landscape of Myrtle Beach.

Today, his imprint has been stamped throughout the Grand Strand on some of the area's most recognizable buildings.

Mozingo, who now has five employees and a partner, Gerald C. Wallace III, designed

Coastal Federal Field, several of the area's most expensive homes, the tennis center at Grande Dunes, and has done work for Horry County Schools and Myrtle Beach International Airport. Mozingo also is working closely with the Myrtle Beach Downtown Redevelopment Advisory Board to help revitalize the area near the Myrtle Beach Pavilion Amusement Park.
